ABOUT YOUR SIDELINE SCREEN CART

1. Your cart will assemble with a 9/16" ratchet and box wrench.
2. You may notice a few scratches at the assembly points. That's because we test-fit the parts before we send the cart to you. Just match up the letters for assembly.
3. The uprights will work on either side of the cart. If you find yourself mostly loading in from one end of the stadium, set up your cart so that you can just roll it down the sideline with your screens.
4. When you are transporting the screens on your band truck or trailer, be sure to secure the screens to the wall of the truck. You can leave them on the cart, but the wall of the truck is much more stable than the cart during transport.
5. You may find it helpful to keep a bungee cord, tarp strap or ratchet strap across the screens until you are about to set them on the field.
6. Your cart is designed to hold 12 Corps Design screens. If your screens are made by another company, you might be able to get more on the cart but be sure to check the weight. For example, 12 CD Screens will weigh 380-500 lbs. Depending on the size. If you try to put 24, 40 lb. screens plus the weight of the cart, you'll have over ½ ton of props to move. This will exceed the caster capacity and really ruin your volunteer's day.
7. For loading these on the field, set your screens on the cart, in order. Mark the back with the coordinates for each screen. Assign a minimum of 2 people: 1 to push, 1 to steer, both to set the screens in place.
8. Pick up the screens in reverse order and you'll be set for the next show.
